The Commissioners of Ridgely met on the above date in the Town Hall at 11:00 AM for the June 2021 Town Meeting. CLERK-TREASURER

DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC WORKS

David Crist the projects at Martin Sutton Park that will be proposed for the \$300,000 LPPI grant. Projects will include fixing the tennis courts, making the basketball courts regulation size, paving parking lots and creating ADA parking, adding 2 regulation baseball fields, adding benches, bike racks and trash cans throughout the park. Commissioner Hurley made a motion to proceed with the grant application with these shovel-ready projects, 2nd Commissioner Casey.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANT

Cathy Schwab discussed that the train station tours were going well. The next tour day will be July 3 from 10-1. The Historical Society is planning a grand opening for the library. They have received a plat from 1912 from Mary Warton's estate.
